

8/2/2012 GAWLER RACES REPORT BY PETER NEALL.

Gary Searle took full advantage of his home turf when his charge Nevele Tol and Fresh Tell brought up a double and gave him his fifth winner from the last three meetings at the Evanston Racecourse last Wednesday.

Fellow trainer John Vandermyle added to the delight of the locals when his charge Slippery Ninja took out the last race.

Searle kept up his good strike rate on the Evanston track when Nevele Tol \$5 brought up a hat trick of wins in the 2122 metre fifth race.

Having the services of Adrian Patterson the Skalato sired Nevele Tol, from the Rubiton mare Innovation Lass, came from a backward position and, coming with a strong run over the concluding stages, recorded a three quarter length win over the Paula Trenwith trained Jake Toeroek ridden Sierra Skies \$9.

Nic's Buddy \$15 was another one and a quarter lengths away filling the minor placing for John Dunn and Dom Tourneur.

Searle said that he will look for an 1800 metre race at Morphetville for the four year old Nevele Tol.

Searle brought up his double when the Jeffrey Maund ridden Fresh Tell \$4.60 was the long head winner of race seven which was run over 1716 metres.

From the Rubiton mare Avaton and sired by Portland Pirate, Fresh Tell came from a rearward position and beat the Karen Brynes trained Paul Gatt guided Cape Silver \$8.

Another Gary Searle prepared runner, the Todd Pannell ridden Just a Giggle \$5.50 was a farther three quarters of a length away third.

Favourite punters left the course on a successful note when the \$2.30 favourite Slippery Ninja brought up a duo of wins in the 1211 metre final event.

Prepared by local trainer John Vandermyle and ridden by Adrian Patterson the Lucky Owner sired three year old Slippery Ninja, from the Tale of the Cat mare Grisabella, came from fourth and defeated the Bill Bogarts prepared Dom Tourneur ridden Under the Radar \$10.

Visual Impact was another short half head away third at \$4.60 for Ken Sweeney and Paul Gatt.

Regarded as a potential staying type by trainers Leon MacDonald and Andrew Gluyas, Tsarina Wonder was the four and a half length winner of the opening event of 2122 metres at Gawler on Wednesday.

Piloted to victory by Clare Lindop the Churchill Downs sired Tsarina Wonder \$5, from the Military Plume mare Queen Tatiana, raced wide in the middle stages before going on to beat the \$3.60 favourite S'Amuse for trainer Ricky Moor and rider Jason Holder.

Five Iron \$5 was a farther six lengths away third for the combination of David Balfour and Paul Gatt.

The combination of Strathalbyn mentor Barry Dunn and rider Dominic Tourneur tasted victory when Bella Dolce, the \$3.20 favourite, was the long head winner of race two which was run over 1211 metres.

From the McFlirt mare Geil and sired by Bel Esprit, Bella Dolce came from a midfield position and beat the David Balfour prepared Troy Baker ridden Delphere \$8.50.

A half length away third was Sheshootsshescores \$4 for Tim Snelling and Todd Pannell.

Barry Dunn said, "I will now step Bella Dolce up in distance to 1600 metres."

Opening his winning account at his sixth start, the \$2.80 chance Pelican Red recorded a long head win in race three which was run over 1211 metres.

Prepared by Daniel Clarken and having the services of his apprentice Lauren Stojakovic the Stratum sired Pelican Red, out of the Fusaichi Pegasus mare Princess Ruhie, came from well back and beat Nadaka \$12 for the combination of Leon MacDonald , Andrew Gluyas and Clare Lindop.

Misty Eyes, the \$2.50 favourite, was a farther one and a quarter lengths away third for Tony McEvoy and Matthew Neilson.

After finishing third in the previous race trainer Tony McEvoy and jockey Matthew Neilson were victorious when Circle of Trust, the \$2.90 favourite, provided them with a long neck win in the 1511 metre fourth race.

A Primus sired three year old Colt from the Made of Gold mare Academy Idol, Circle of Trust came from a rearward position and beat the Ken Sweeney prepared Paul Gatt ridden Set To Excite \$4.

Besa Bola \$8 was a farther three quarters of a length away third for Scott Trenowden and Simon Price.

Tony McEvoy said that he will look at a race over a similar distance in the city for Circle of Trust.

Jockey Chad Lever brought up his first winner after resuming riding following a knee reconstruction, when he booted home the Will Clarken trained Prophets \$5.50 in the 1111 metre sixth race.

Winning by a margin of long neck the Zeditave sired Prophets, from Nativism, a daughter of Maroof, led all the way and defeated the Ken Sweeney prepared Clare Lindop ridden Our Belvoir, the \$2.40 favourite.

Local trainer John Vandermyle and rider Simon Price provided the third placegetter Lady Lightfoot \$5, a farther long neck away.
